Photoville Fence in Winchester 2020

June 20, 2020 (Winchester, MA) On May 21, 2020 the Griffin Museum of Photography and the Winchester Cultural District presented before the Select Board of Winchester a petition to install the Photoville Fence in Winchester in the Winchester Cultural District. The request was met with enthusiastic approval by the Winchester Select Board and the Town Manager, Lisa Wong. The Photoville Fence in Winchester was installed by Photoville and opened on June 20th. The installations will be up through September 27, 2020.

The presenting partners of the Photoville Fence in Winchester are the Photoville Fence, the Griffin Museum of Photography and the Winchester Cultural District. The supporting partners are the Griffin Foundation, The Massachusetts Cultural Council, The Winchester Cultural Council, The Town of Winchester, Mary McKenna & Associates and Winchester and Burlington High School Students. This installation is the [eighth edition](#) of the Fence. A [New England Showcase](#) is also featured as part of the installation as well as an exhibition of students work from Winchester High School and Burlington High School.
