Debe Arlook is a photographer, mentor, writer and fine art digital printer based in Los Angeles. Arlook joined the PhotoBook Journal staff as Resource Manager and Contributor in 2019. She became an Advisory Board Member of Pasadena Photography Arts in 2020 as curator and host with FORUM and Open Show Pasadena/East Los Angeles. During the pandemic she founded the Photography Artist Trīb, where she leads established photographers in arts and meditation practice.
