

Bill Gore - Biography

Bill Gore grew up in Louisiana and seemed always to have a special connection to the natural sciences, the environment, and photography. He studied chemistry in college, received a Ph.D. from Syracuse University, and from there went on to work as a researcher in pharmaceuticals, chemicals, and imaging science. For a time he led a research laboratory at Polaroid and contributed to the development of new photographic media. His photographs have received recognition in numerous juried exhibitions. Two of his books "SWIPE" (2015) and "Side Roads" (2016) were accepted to the juried self-published photography book exhibitions PHOTOBOOK 2015 and PHOTOBOOK 2016 at the Griffin Museum of Photography.
